

### ARTICLE XV ANTI-TRUST COMPLIANCE

### SECTION 1. POLICY

It is the undeviating policy of the Association to comply strictly with the letter and spirit of all federal, state and applicable international trade regulations and antitrust laws. Any activities of the Association or Association-related actions of its staff, members, officers, directors or chapter officials which violate these regulations and laws are detrimental to the interests of the Association and are unequivocally contrary to Association policy.

### SECTION 2. IMPLEMENTATION

Implementation of the antitrust compliance policy of the Association shall include, but shall not be limited to, the following:

- 2.1 Association membership, directors and committee/alliance/division meetings shall be conducted pursuant to agendas distributed in advance to attendees; discussions shall be limited to agenda items; there shall be no substantive discussions of Association matters other than at membership, directors and committee/alliance/division meetings; minutes shall be distributed to attendees promptly.
- 2.2 All Association activities or discussions shall be avoided which might be construed as tending to: (1) raise, lower, or stabilize prices; (2) regulate production; (3) allocate markets; (4) encourage boycotts; (5) foster unfair trade practices; (6) assist monopolization; or in any way violate federal, state or applicable international trade regulations and antitrust laws.
- 2.3 No individual other than the Chair of the Board and Chief Executive Officer--whether staff, member, officer, director or committee/alliance/division official--is authorized to communicate on behalf of the Association to any person or firm outside the Association except with the explicit, unequivocal approval of the Chair of the Board or President. No such individual may bind or commit the Association to any offer, contract, policy, program, position or decision without that approval. And no such individual may hold out himself or herself, or willingly appear to do so, as representing the Association without that approval.
- 2.4 NGA legal counsel shall attend all NGA Board and membership meetings, either in person or via teleconference. Attendance of counsel at other meetings shall be at the discretion of the NGA Chair of the Board.
- 2.5 Association staff, members, officers, directors or committee/alliance/division officials who participate in conduct which the Board of Directors, by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote, determines to be contrary to the Association anti-trust compliance policy shall be subject to disciplinary measures up to, and including, termination.



### NATIONAL GLASS ASSOCIATION

### **CONFLICTS OF INTEREST POLICY**

This Conflicts of Interest Policy applies to all National Glass Association (NGA) staff, members, officers, directors, chapter officials, and all members of a committee, division or task force of NGA as designated by the Board of Directors ("interested persons").

As an interested person, I recognize that I owe duties of care and loyalty to NGA. One aspect of fulfilling those duties is to avoid conflicts of interest in which my allegiance might be split between my position with NGA and some other personal, professional, or volunteer position or responsibility. To help avoid conflicts, I will disclose other situations or areas in which it might even appear that I have interests conflicting with those of NGA. I invite any further review by the NGA of any aspects of these situations or areas which might be considered appropriate.

Using the NGA Conflicts of Interest Disclosure Form provided by NGA staff, I will disclose potential conflicts to the Chair of the Board (or in the case of the Chair, to the Treasurer) and/or to the members of any committees, divisions or task forces of NGA as designated by the Board annually and as they arise. For each interest disclosed, the Chair (or Treasurer) will determine whether to: (a) take no action; (b) assure full disclosure to the Board of Directors and/or the relevant committee, division, or task force; (c) ask for recusal from participation in related discussions or decisions; or (d) ask for voluntary resignation from the Board, or, potentially, removal in accordance with NGA's removal procedures or voluntary resignation from the relevant committee, division or task force. NGA's CEO will also monitor proposed and ongoing transactions for potential conflicts of interest.

### Disclosure of interests:

Personal, professional, or volunteer positions or responsibilities, including those of mine and/or my family members, that might give rise to conflicts (examples include serving in a position of leadership for another association in the glass or residential window and door industry, or performing work for the NGA or another association in the glass or residential window and door industry).

### Step. 2 Staff Review

Technical Services & Advocacy Director Urmilla Sowell, along with Content Director Jenni Chase, will review project idea/creation forms and make a recommendation to NGA President & CEO Nicole Harris as to how the project should proceed given budget and staff capacity.

# Step 3. President Review

Nicole reviews director recommendations. Forwards projects to board for approval if unbudgeted or outside staff capacity.

# Step 4. Board of Directors Approval (if necessary)

If the new project is unbudgeted or exceeds current staff capacity, board will need to approve.

# Step 5. Task Group Work Begins

Task group elects a Chair at the first meeting and works with NGA staff towards completion of draft resource for ballot.

**RE:** Publication Development Process

The Integration Task Force (ITF) with staff has been reviewing the method and types of technical publications the Association produces through lens of both process and our <u>strategic goals</u>.

Currently, we produce three types of technical publications: glass informational bulletins (GIBs), white papers and manuals. The distinction between GIBs and white papers has become hazy over recent years. Also, the length of GIBs has continued to grow which lengthens the time it takes to write and publish technical documents for distribution to members, the industry and our stakeholders, including architects and building owners.

Below is a summary of proposed changes for your perspective and input. Please also refer to the Publication Matrix sheet describing the scope, format and development process of each resource type.

1. Glass Informational Bulletins (GIBs) were first intended to provide a high-level summary of a single topic with the goal of making industry aware of an important issue without delving into deep technical details needed by experts


The ITF believes it is time to rekindle this original GANA approach and instruct task group members to draft one-two page (950-1,270 word) summaries on single topics, and then write the detailed document which would be separately identified as a Glass Technical Paper

- 2. **Glass Technical Papers (GTPs)** would take the format of current-day GIBs, 2-10 (950 5,000 word) pages in length allowing for greater elaboration and detail on a topic introduced by the GIB
- 3. Standards represent select resources to be developed specifically for future ASTM standard adoption
  - a. Composition begins within the ASTM template
  - b. As long-term resource standards documents have no page length restriction
- 4. **Manuals** often originate from an outline on a broad-reaching topic and contain multiple sections; existing GIBs are reviewed for citation or direct incorporation into applicable sections

### This approach has several benefits:

- Member companies would see the results of volunteer efforts sooner and with higher visibility: Glass Magazine would publish the GIB summary as soon as it is balloted.
- Current and new/potential readers learn about an issue quickly with the option to pursue deeper research by reading the complete Technical Paper.
- Strengthens the Association as the technical authority with more frequent new releases and repeat exposure (GIB published and promoted; Technical Paper published and promoted)
- Enables the Association to publish new resources more quickly and showcase the volunteer effort.
- Creates a new member benefit driver by charging non-members to download the more-detailed Technical Paper (GANA did at one time make GIBs a members-only benefit).

We look forward to discussing this with you.



### NATIONAL GLASS ASSOCIATION with GANA

### **Committee Voting Protocol Parameters**

NGA's four committees--Advocacy, Forming, Fabricating and Installing--share voting protocol parameters to achieve consensus, with the goal of moving forward with the association's annual and long-term strategic goals and objectives. The following diagram outlines the protocol parameters across the committees, noting differences among them.

Committees are made up of committed member and industry volunteers who agree to abide by this protocol to maintain and promote effective action.

- Members may select to be a corresponding member no vote, but information is distributed to them for selected committees.
- Member companies must ACTIVELY return ballots on time.
- All ballots are open for 21 business days and close at 5 pm eastern time on closing day.
- Three consecutively missed ballots per committee results in loss of voting privilege on that committee for three months.
- NGA to set up system to inform of ballot close 10 business days & 1 business day prior to due date; reminders sent only to those remiss.
- Request for vote to be returned to a member will be addressed by Committee Chair with approval by BOD and must be submitted in writing. A new voting member must be named.
- Repealed vote to be treated as corresponding member; will receive all notices and information from committee.
- All committee ballots approved by a simple majority (51%).
- All ballots must have a minimum 66% response rate of the voting members to be valid.
- Votes to be cast as: Approve, Approve with Comment, Disapprove with Comment & Abstain.
- Abstentions are removed from count for simple majority.
- Negative votes must have comments. Comments must contain the following information to be considered:
  - Title of document being commented on
  - Direct and clear reference of material being rejected (paragraph, line, table number, figure number etc.)
  - Reason for rejection
  - Suggested language or changes required to resolve negative
  - All properly submitted Disapproving comments from voting members must be considered. Others (non-voting; improper format) may be taken up as new business or found non-persuasive at the discretion of the Committee Chair.

### **FABRICATING COMMITTEE**

- NGA members have ONE vote per company; voting member listed on glass.org.
- Each company shall have a primary and alternate voting member assigned.

### **INSTALLING COMMITTEE**

- NGA members have ONE vote per company; voting member listed on glass.org.
- Members must ACTIVELY participate in Committee meetings (minimum of two per year). Three consecutively missed meetings results in loss of voting privilege.

### **ADVOCACY**

- Voting positions determined based on input from members, BOD, and consultation with experts to guard against special interests and minimal input decisions.
  - GICC Regulatory (see GICC Protocol) open to all paying members of GICC.



  - The need for a document addressing copper-free mirror was expressed. It was also noted that topic generated the negative on the Green Aspects of Mirror ballot, mentioned above. The task group will address copper-free mirror as appropriate in the existing GIB before determining if a new resource is still needed.

### Decorative - Sylvain Denis, Walker Glass Co., Ltd.

- Decorative Glazing Manual
  - The outline for the manual was reviewed noting the GIBs that are already available for use in the manual and those that may still need developed based on the goals of the manual: daylighting, indoor environment quality; and, fabricating and processing of decorative glass product.
- Defining an Acceptable Color Variance
  - The draft document was reviewed noting the goal being to set an acceptable color variance with a delta E number.
  - o Task Group: add Elizabeth Cotton
- Measuring Color Variance in the Field
  - A new task group was formed to aid in the completion of the above GIB on Defining Acceptable Color Variance. This task group will develop a procedure to take color measurements in the field, using ASTM C1376 as a baseline.

- Best Practices for Installed Painted Decorative Glass


